Moran College at a Glance:

Established in 1964 the college was started with 68 students- 60 boys and 8 girls. It got approval for opening pre university classes from Gauhati University classes from Gauhati University on 23rd May 1964 and got Deficit Grant College from the status from the Govt. in 1974. Since 1985 has been imparting higher education at degree level in both the Arts and Science stream having core as well as Major courses.

The college celebrated its Silver Jubilee in 1989 and Golden Jubilee in 2014 with many colourful programmes and academic activities. It is our pride that the college frequently produces excellent results in UG programmes. The college has attractive campus spread over an area of 19.3 acres of land, in the vicinity of Moranhat Town. It provides quality higher education in Arts and Science streams at graduate level. College runs 14 UG and 05 Diploma course and 01 Certificate course. The college permanently affiliated to Dibrugarh University, Dibrugarh and is approved under section 2(f) and 12(b) of the University Grant Commission act. The College was reaccredited with B grade by NAAC with CGPA 2.77 in 2012.

Moran College was established in 1964 with a vision to reach the economically backward, enabling the rural students who are interested to pursue higher education.
